Have had quite a day, in spite of

stairs. After lunch, went to Père La
Chaise - a most interesting old cemetery.

vaults are made very deep -

some holding 70 - a tiny marble structure

Then we went au bon Marché,
+ the game was great - more
than Macy's. Père LaChaise
was twice the scene of Revolu-
tions. The Communards were

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Shot down. Some dug open vaults, & mut
in. The camping soldiers got the idea
& cemented the vaults.

Fri. Dec. 7.

Another rainy day. Went among the
shops - nice lunch at Courve Hotel -
spent the P.M. among the pictures.
Saw the Apis, found by Mariette Bey -
marked with triangle between the horns
& large eagle on the back.

Sat. Dec. 8.

Very little rain. Walked to the Place
de la Concorde, where so many noted
people were guillotined - then along
the Champs Elysees to the Arc de la
Triomphe. Lunch at the Elysee Palace
Hotel. Great style. Then through the
Exposition grounds, where the men
are tearing down the pretty buildings.
Went to the Pantheon - then to Notre
Dame, with its medieval & highly
covered statue of Virgin & Child.
Both were held by Communards.
Cook - bank & home.

Sun. Dec. 9.

Went to high mass at the Madeleine this a.m. Good music, & an opera singer. A crowd - a beautiful group of marble angels for an altar - a major domo, asking for alms for St. Pierre - a woman always picking up pennies for the charms - & "Ces Sœurs!" behind us. After lunch went to a concert, of which M. Colonne was the director. They are said to be the finest concerts in the world. Never less than 150 pieces. Singers from the opera, & a magnificent pianist - a lady, dressed in a black velvet & gold Greek costume. No rain today.

Mon. Dec. 10

Left Paris at 10.30, reaching Boulogne Sur Mer at 2 P.M. Much trouble finding out about the boat. Had to wait till 5 - so went to the Cathedral, on the hill, in the old city. It was plain, but large & graceful, with a fine dome, made into a Lady Chapel, at the back of the altar.

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Then we walked on the ramparts - the finest we have seen, with a great gravel walk, a row of large trees on either side. The wall was built in the 3rd century - with fine gates. Remains of an old Roman wall were found. A monument in the form of a pyramid was raised to Mariette, who was born at Boulogne - died at Cairo. When we got on board the lighter, we found the steamer was late, + we waited for two hours before we left the dock. Then trouble getting on board - + lots of trouble with the baggage - two satchels lost. On board

Tues. Dec. 11.

All day pleasantly on deck. Satchels found. More passengers on at Plymouth. A good view of the town. The sea seems a little rough.

Tues. Dec. 18

Wing to feel sea sick. So I left. The
next day was very rough but I got on
deck, between spells. The sea grew
worse, & I spent the next two days in my
berth, miserable enough, but I took the
ship's doctor's advice - "Eat a little" &
"Lure enough, soon, keep no more."
I believe it is very good advice for
life. The next two days, had my meals
on deck. They came down to dinner, &
found many glad to see me. The
sea has been mild - head winds all
the time. Most of the people have been
more or less miserable. We are array
behind time, & we have no idea when
we shall get to N.Y. The ship is slow &
comfortable. Have had a number
of snow squalls. Today the wind has
changed - the sea is calm - we have
gone 289 miles, & all are enjoying life.
Talking about the Capt.'s dinner, & getting
up the concert. Will read the service
last Sunday.
